Dear Ms. Connor:

We write pursuant to Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 28(j). Plaintiff-Appellant in the above-captioned case has relied on the Ninth Circuit's decision in Fazaga v. Federal Bureau of Investigation, 965 F.3d 1015 (9th Cir. 2020) in arguing for reversal here. See Opening Br. 16, 46, 47, 49, 51, 55, 56, 59, 60, 61; Reply Br. 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 10, 11, 15. The government writes to inform the Court that the government filed a petition for a writ of certiorari in Fazaga on December 17, 2020. See Supreme Court Dkt. No. 20-828, https://www.supremecourt.gov/ Search.aspx?FileName=/docket/docketfiles/html/public\20-828.html. As the government has explained, the district court's judgment here should be affirmed even under Fazaga's reasoning because Fazaga did not address the resolution of threshold issues (such as standing) and any disposition of those threshold issues here would jeopardize privileged state secrets. See Gov't Br. 27-28. In any event, Fazaga was wrongly decided. See Gov't Br. 16-23, 27 & n.2, 31-37. We will notify this Court once the Supreme Court acts on the Fazaga petition.
