Pursuant to Rule 65(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and Rule 65-1 1 2 of the Local rules of this court, Plaintiffs hereby submits this Ex Parte Application for a Temporary Restraining Order and Order to Show Cause re Preliminary 3 Injunction to ensure Defendants protect the constitutional rights of people held in 4 5 the Inmate Reception Center (IRC) at the Los Angeles County Jails and abide by the Judgment and other prior orders in this action, an order forbidding Defendants 6 7 from: 1. 8 Holding an incarcerated person in the IRC for more than 24 hours; 9 2. Holding an incarcerated person on the IRC Clinic Front Bench,

10 handcuffed, chained, or tethered to a chair or any other object, for more than 4 11 hours. In the event an individual remains on the Front Bench for more than four hours, Defendants shall document the following: 12

13 a. Date and time the individual was first placed on the Front Bench; 14 b. The reasons why the individual is on the Front Bench, including 15 any mental health diagnosis;

c. Date and time of initial mental health screening;

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- 17 d. Date and time of any subsequent mental health or medical evaluation; 18
- 19 e. Date and time each individual was removed from the Front Bench temporarily, how long the person remained untethered, and the 20 reason why (e.g., escort to bathroom, mental health screening);
 - f. Date and time each individual was permanently removed from the Front Bench;

g. Location of individual after removal from Front Bench.

Plaintiffs shall be provided with this documentation upon request. 25 26 3. Holding more than 10 incarcerated persons in a holding cell without first exhausting every other means to avoid placing more than 10 incarcerated 27

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persons in a holding cell. In the event more than 10 incarcerated persons are placed

1	in a holding cell, this event shall be documented as follows:		
2	(a) name of the officer approving the placement;		
3	(b) date and time of placement;		
4	(c) type of placement;		
5	(d) date and time of release;		
6	(e) number of persons in the cell at time of placement;		
7	(f) identification of the particular holding cell.		
8	Plaintiffs shall be provided with this documentation upon request;		
9	4. Holding an incarcerated person in a holding cell or the cage in the		
10	clinic area for longer than 24 hours. In the event that an incarcerated person is		
11	detained in a holding cell or the cage for longer than 24 hours, Defendants shall		
12	document the following:		
13	(a) name of the officer approving the placement;		
14	(b) date and time of placement;		
15	(c) type of placement;		
16	(d) date and time of release from the holding cell or cage, and date		
17	and time each individual was permanently moved from the holding cell		
18	or cage;		
19	(e) number of persons in the cell or cage at time of placement;		
20	(f) identification of the particular holding cell.		
21	Plaintiffs shall be provided with this documentation upon request;		
22	5. Holding an incarcerated person in the clinic area, cage, or any cell in		
23	the IRC which is not maintained in a clean and sanitary condition, including access		
24	to functioning toilets, potable drinking water, and clean water to wash;		
25	6. Holding an incarcerated person in the IRC without providing ongoing		
26	access to adequate medical and mental health care, including but not limited to		
27	regular pill call and sick call.		
28	This Application is supported by the accompanying Memorandum of Points		

and Authorities and contemporaneously filed declarations and exhibits.
